The owners of the Last Chance claim, Big Bend, have spent \$22,000 piercing 2,200 feet of tunnel in all, and have not yet struck bed rock.

Considerable activity has been manifested in things pertaining to the Big Bend, and the general opinion seems to be that it will develop in a surprising manner during the coming season. Residents are daily in receipt of letters from miners inquiring about packing rates, distances and assays. Some of the mines have been running all winter and have made excellent returns; notably the Consolidation, which one enthusiast says will be to Revelstoke what the Silver King is to Nelson. Other claims, which in years past have been worked until shortly before the paying point could have been reached, are now being developed and give promise of equalling others which gave good indications from the first.

The owners of the Last Chance claim on McCulloch creek, in the Big Bend country, although they have spent \$22,000 in running two tunnels that did not strike bedrock, have still faith in the ground. One tunnel is in 1,000 feet and the other in 1,500. The lease expires in July, but it will be renewed. The owners are Josiah Fletcher, T. J. Landrum, G. C. Tunstall, jr., W. M. Brown, William McKenzie, John Bell, Thomas Ardell, Alex. Bitland, and John Sanderson. The latter left Nelson this week for the claim, and he will probably have five others at work with him.
