Manganese minerals occur in tightly folded beds of cherty tuff of the Palaeozoic Sicker Group and cover an area not more than 100 feet north-south by 50 feet eastwest. Lenses of rhodonite and rhodochrosite lie parallel to bedding of the host rock and are thinly coated with oxides. Rhodochrosite is present in small amounts, mainly in irregular masses that grade into finely crystalline rhodonite.
