A flume was built to convey water from Eagle Creek, and hydraulicking operations were carried on for two seasons, under the direction of Judge Murphy. The proportion of gold to platinum at this point was about one to two, and the recovery of platinum was high; but the available ground was limited, and the results obtained did not pay for the cost of plant and management."
