Bur. of Mines, B. C., Ann. Rep. 1915, p. 364.

The group of 7 hydraulic leases held by this Company are situated on the high bank of the Tulameen river, 7 miles above Princeton and about 4 miles below Granite Creek. This ground is supposed to include an old channel of Granite Creek.

In 1914, water rights were taken up on Six-Mile and Lost Creeks.

"Results in gold and platinum extracted (in 1914) were encouraging. 95% of the gold obtained was coarse, and platinum constituted 36% of the total value of the precious metals extracted."
