Antimony A promising antimony, gold deposit is the Stibnite group of claims owned by George Powell of Lillooet, B.C. This property is located 19 miles from Lillooet and one-quarter mile from the main road to Lytton. According to Mr. Powell the antimony occurs in 8 quartz vein with about ten inches of pure stibnite on one wall. There is said to be a diorite hanging-wall and a sedimentary footwall. The quartz vein is said to vary from a few inches to 7 ft. in width and has been uncovered for a distance of 750 ft. where it enters gravel banks. Free gold is visable in places and some assays have run \$36 in this metal. A drift tunnel 20 ft. in length was driven on the vein from which a 500-lb. sample was taken across a 3-ft. width. This assayed 42 per cent antimony. Selected ore shipment to Derby & Co. of London ran 53.04 per cent antimony WESTERN MINER Fine Gold visible and assay to as high as \$36.00 per ton Quartz vein showing 10 inches of purestibnite on one wall, 500 lb. samples assayed 42% antimony.
