This occurrence is located on the west side of Anderson Lake about 1 km south of McGillivray Creek and some 33 km southeast of Bralorne. It is adjacent to the Lucky Jane talc deposit (92 J/9, TLC 1).

DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT/DESCRIPTION DU GISEMENT

Host rock is a miarolitic granite intrusive from 1 to 2½ miles wide that is considered to be younger than the Coast Range batholith and of probable Cretaceous age. Locally the intrusive is a medium-grained and highly miarolitic. The miarolitic cavities are more than ordinarily abundant. The rock consists principally of orthoclase, quartz, and albite-oligoclase. The accessory minerals are apatite and fluorite, the latter being more abundant.
