DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

The area is underlain by Cretaceous Longarm sediments. The coal seams are interbedded with shales over an interval

of 13 feet. The bed dips 30 degrees southwest.

An analysis of the upper portion of the seam gave values of 1.80 per cent moisture, 30.67 per cent volatile combustible matter, 19.63 per cent fixed carbon, and 47.90 per cent ash.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

The showing is located midway in the length of Holberg Inlet, on the north side near Clesklogh Creek. The elevation is about 175 feet.

The Quatsino Coal Syndicate, under the management of T.P. Pearson, prospected the area for coal in about 1904.

In 1907 work on Pearson's "Upper Camp" included two adits totalling 320 feet and a bore-hole of 110 feet.

In 1910 and 1911 the underground workings were extended 1,400 feet.
