DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

The area is underlain by andesite flows and interbedded chert, tuff, and amphibole-rich rocks of the Lower Jurassic Bonanza Formation. These are randomly cut by narrow andesite and diorite dykes. A small diorite stock intrudes the volcanic rocks on Battle 2 claim.

Pyrite, pyrrhotite, and chalcopyrite occurs in the bedded volcanic and sedimentary rocks. Pyrite, which occurs in amounts up to 15 per cent, is commonly disseminated throughout. Pyrrhotite is sporadic and chalcopyrite is low, averaging 0.05 per cent copper.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

The property is located $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles north-northeast of the head of Nasparti Inlet, at approximately 2,000 feet elevation.

In 1974, Kennco Explorations, (Western) Limited held the Battle 1 to 6 claims. Surface geological mapping and a geochemical survey of 20 silt samples and 30 rock samples was carried out on the claims.
