The Owl and Snowbird Nos. 1-3 claims (Lots 1585-1588) were Crown-granted in 1921 to Messrs. Sullivan, Evenson, and Baker.

Empire Development Co. Ltd., formed in 1956 by Quatsino Copper-Gold Mines, Limited (40%) and Mannix Ltd. (60%), conducted a dip-needle survey on the claims in 1961.
