DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT/DESCRIPTION DU GISEMENT

The property is underlain by locally pyritized Pennsylvanian or Permian pelites and argillites intruded and hornfelsed by a Triassic or Jurassic quartz diorite stock and dyke swarm. All the rocks are cut by numerous quartz veins up to a metre in width and variably mineralized with pyrite, chalcopyrite, pyrrhotite, molybdenite, rare bismuth tellurides, and free gold. Drilling to late 1986 indicated mineable grades of 0.6 oz/t Au over mineable widths of 1.2 m.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT  
HISTORIQUE DE L'EXPLORATION ET DE LA MISE EN VALEUR

The property is located at about 5 500 feet elevation in the Wentowrth Lake-Bob Creek area some 35 km north of Kamloops.

Goldquest I Limited Partnership, as a result of regional heavy metal silt surveys and prospecting in the 1983-85 period, located four clusters of mineralized boulders. About 57 units were staked in the Nubob and Rebob claims.

Inter-Pacific Resources Corp. optioned a 75 % interest in 1985 and acquired a 100 % interest in 1986. Work by Inter-Pacific in 1985-86 included a magnetometer survey over 7.1 km, geochemical surveys comprising 257 soil and 88 rock samples, trenching, and 1129.9 m of diamond drilling in 7 NQ holes; hole No. 6 cut 2.8 feet assaying 1.04 oz/t Au, 0.33 oz/t Ag.

Hughes Lang Corporation, a member of the Hughes-Lang Group of Companies, optioned a 50 % interest in the property from Inter-Pacific late in 1986. Work under the option agreement before year end included 27 trenches and 22 diamond drill holes ( ) on 5 vein showings. Drilling on the Crow vein over a 213 feet length indicated a proven and probable 10 200 tonnes containing 6 200 ozs gold, with an additional possible 10 000 tonnes containing 6 000 ozs gold (George Cross News Letter, 16/01/87).
