This Syndicate consisted of 9 or 10 C.P.R. employees, with Mr. C. W. Gladwin as Secretary. It acquired several leases. The Clearwater river enters the North Thompson 83 mls. N. of Kamloops. The prospecting party found that the bars yielded returns of 33 cents per c. yd., and that the black sand contained grains of a white-looking metal. Samples of the black sand, assayed by Messrs. Baker and Co., platinum refiners, Newark, N. J., gave: gold, 16 oz., and platinum, 124 oz. per ton. This discovery created some excitement.
