DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

Copper mineralization occurs in a number of parallel and branching veins, about 6 inches wide, striking N42°E and dipping steeply eastward. The veins occur in a sheared quartz diorite at intervals for a horizontal distance of about 700 feet. The width of this shear zone is from 25 to 30 feet.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

The property is located just north of the summit of Big Timothy Mountain, approximately 50 miles east of Williams Lake.

The showings were staked by W.J. Ryan in 1914 and some development carried out in the form of open cuts, pits, and short adits on several different veins. The showings were restaked in 1928 by T.H. Hamilton and R. Cavanagh. Assessment work was reported in 1929, however, as in the case of the original owner, interest shifted to the Boss Mountain molybdenum showings about 2 miles to the southeast and nothing further was reported on the copper showing.
