## DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

The property is underlain by intercalated sediments and volcanics. A sheared and oxidized zone, 20 feet wide, strikes 68°E for 500 feet. Small, 6 inch wide, quartz stringers occur at intervals, are mineralized with pyrite and galena. Samples assayed 0.04 oz. per ton gold, 4.2 oz. per ton silver and 9 per cent lead.

Associated minerals or products of value - Silver.

## HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

The property is located 10½ miles from Quesnel, on the east side of Dragon Mountain, at elevation 3,440 feet.

The Cousin Jack group (7 claims) was located by A.S. Vaughan in 1934. Two shallow pits were dug.
