DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

A sample submitted to the Mines Branch, Ottawa, consisted of placer sand that had been washed and screened through 40 mesh. It contained clear free gold in a fairly wide size range. The gold could be panned out in a black sand concentrate that contained some magnetite. Practically all of the gold is free and recoverable by amalgamation.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

The property is located on the W bank of the Fraser River, 1 mile N of the mouth of Chimney Creek and $7\frac{1}{2}$ miles SW of Williams Lake.

The property consisted of 160 acres, on Placer Mining Leases 3415 and 3416, owned by the Chimney Creek-Fraser Placer Mines Limited, which was incorporated in January 1944.

During 1947-48, a total of 18 test pits were sunk for sampling purposes. A sample of placer sand submitted to the Mines Branch, Ottawa, in 1948 gave assays of 0.021 and 0.03 ounces of gold per ton. In 1949, the leases were estimated to contain 500,000 cubic yards averaging \$1 per cubic yard or better.

In 1951, the mining rights were granted to A.McLean Moffat Prospecting and Gold Dredging Syndicate.
