Small seams of chalcopryrite occur along a shear zone in granodiorite. The shear zone strikes N60°W and dips southwest at 65 degrees. A sample of selected mineral assayed: gold, trace; silver, 1 ounce a ton; copper, 4%.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT
HISTORIQUE DE L'EXPLORATION ET DE LA MISE EN VALEUR

This property is located at about the 2,680 foot elevation on the south side of the Nechako River, about 3½ miles south-southeast of Fort Fraser.

The Nechako group was owned by A. Goodwin in 1928. Exploration work during 1928-29 included open cuts and a 37 foot deep shaft.

The Art group of about 100 claims was staked late in 1967. Plateau Metals Limited carried out geophysical and geochemical surveys on the property in 1968.
