DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

Molybdenite with some chalcopyrite and magnetite occurs in quartz veins in shears and faults in Casey granite at its contact with Glenannan granite. The molybdenite occurs as coarse platings, fine disseminations, and dense fine grained seams. (Mineral Deposit Inventory, Property No. 2657, British Columbia Dept. of Mines).

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

The property is located at the northwest corner of Tatin Lake, 4 miles northwest of the village of Endako.

The Ken 1-18 claims were held in 1968 by Amax Exploration, Inc. Geological mapping and a geochemical soil survey were carried out. Additional staking was done to a total of 58 claims. Work during 1969 included a ground magnetometer survey over 26 line-miles on Ken 1-24 claims; an electromagnetic survey over 12 line-miles on the Ken 1-6, 10, 12, 22 claims and induced polarization and resistivity surveys over 9 line-miles on the same claims; 21 trenches totalling 3,400 feet were bulldozed in overburden.
