HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

Tatlow is a station on the Canadian National Railway 6 miles southeast of Smithers.

Thomas Campbell and associates, under the name "Northwest Anthracite Syndicate", began prospecting the showings in 1938. During 1939 an incline begun on No. 2 seam was driven about 100 feet.

OWNER OR OPERATOR AND ADDRESS

DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

Several small coal seams are reported to occur on the south bank of the Bulkley River at Tatlow. One seam was said to contain good grade blacksmith coal. The face of the incline on No. 2 seam shows the following section: Shale roof; coal, 4 inches; shale, 7 inches; coal, 10 inches; shale floor.
