Northwest-striking Jurassic volcanic and sedimentary rocks are intruded by quartz monzonite and hornblende biotite porphyry within the claim group.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

The property is located at approximately 3,000 foot elevation, east of the northwest arm of Babine Lake, 7 miles south of Babine village.

The Babe, Frisbee, Luk, Thorn, and Tot groups, totalling 237 claims, were owned by Noranda Exploration Company, Limited. Work during 1969 and 1970 included geological mapping, a geochemical soil survey, air and ground magnetic and electromagnetic surveys, an induced potential survey, and 2,620 feet of diamond drilling in 14 holes.
