HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT
HISTORIQUE DE L'EXPLORATION ET DE LA MISE EN VALEUR

The Omineca River has not been mined for placer gold to any extent, the only work being small-scale operations on a few bars. Prospecting of the bars prior to 1899 by means of Rockers and Long Toms is reported to have paid from \$1 to \$3 per day; the gold recovered was very fine. Some testing of the gravels between the mouth of Germansen River and Old Hogem, a distance of about 40 miles, was done in 1914 by H.B. Perks. The testing was done by means of 52 pits, which could be put down to water level only and bedrock was not reached in them. The results therefor gave no information as to depth or average value of the gravel. It would seem probable that much of the ground along this river is deep and only low-grade gravels on the average could be expected.
