DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

Much of the area is covered by glacial drift, but, in general, the claims area is underlain by andesitic volcanic rocks of the Upper Triassic Takla group. A quartz diorite intrusive rock is exposed in outcrop about one half mile east of the open cuts. The open cuts expose mineralization consisting of chalcopyrite, pyrrhotite, and pyrite in fractures and disseminations within andesite and andesite porphyry.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

This property is located at the 3,500 foot elevation on a northeasterly flowing tributary of Wittsichica Creek, near the east end of Witch Lake, some 37 miles south of Manson Creek.

King-Bell Resources Ltd., incorporated April 1969 as a wholly-owned subsidiary of Ambassador Mines Ltd., acquired by purchase and option agreement 22 claims in the AL and BUZ groups. Previous work on the property consisted of two open cuts by Mr. T.H. Taylor, staker of the Buz 1-5 and Hoo No. 4 claims.
