DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT/DESCRIPTION DU GISEMENT

The formation consists of schists, quartzites, and gneisses, of probable Pre-Cambrian age. In the vicinity of the occurrence the gneisses have the appearance of parallel bands of granitic rock of different phases, the width of each band being a few feet. Pyrrhotite occurs in the more basic phases and is inter-crystallized with the other constituent minerals. In places pyrrhotite shows over a width of 20 feet. A sample of selected pyrrhotite assayed only a trace of gold and silver.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

This occurrence is located on Lorimer (Ruby) Creek, an easterly flowing tributary of the Finlay River some 11 miles south of Fort Grahame. The property was owned by J. Lehti of Finlay Forks in 1930. No development work has been reported.
