HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT  
HISTORIQUE DE L'EXPLORATION ET DE LA MISE EN VALEUR

Bullion Creek flows southerly into the headwaters of Kutcho Creek about 5 miles west of Rainbow Lakes.

No information has been found on the discovery of gold on this creek; the first recorded production was in 1926. Seven leases, located just above the canyon, were worked by Messrs. Hylands and Blick in 1933.

DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT/DESCRIPTION DU GISEMENT

Bullion Creek is about 4 miles long, with a drop in altitude of about 700 feet. The lower section of the creek just above the outlet flows through a deep rocky canyon about  $\frac{3}{4}$  of a mile in length. Above the canyon the trough gradually widens to a comparatively flat drift-filled valley. Bedrock consists of schist, slate, and a rusty carbonate rock with quartz stringers. In places it is soft and decomposed and covered with a layer of clay which was found to contain coarse gold. The creek-wash is comparatively heavy, with boulders averaging about 2 feet in diameter, with a few up to 5 feet in diameter.

HISTORY OF PRODUCTION/HISTORIQUE DE LA PRODUCTION

From 1926-1940 the recorded production was 91 ounces of gold.
