Rip Van Mining Ltd., incorporated August 1966, acquired the Ram and Sheep groups of 40 claims. Subsequent staking in the Ewe, Wolf, Kid, Winkle, Sno, and Hub groups brought the total to 104 claims. Work during 1967-69 included a geological survey, trenching, and diamond drilling in 6 holes totalling 3,143 feet.

El Paso Mining and Milling Company held the Wolf 1-20 and Kid 1-4 claims in 1970. Work included geological mapping, a geochemical soil survey, and the excavation of 33 pits for prospecting purposes. In 1972 trenching was reported on Wolf 3 and 5.
