Coarse gold, rough and often full of quartz. Productive section of the creek was about 1 mile in length.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

Defot Creek flows northwesterly into Canyon Creek, about 15 miles northwest of the north end of Dease Lake. In 1878 the creek proved to be rich over a limited area.
