DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

A vein zone about 22 feet wide strikes northwesterly and dips vertical. An 8 foot width of the vein is locally well mineralized. An assay of this section gave: gold, 0.075 oz./ton; silver, 16 ozs./ton; lead, 8.0%; zinc, 26%.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

The property is located on Mt. Erickson about 3 miles northeast of Tulsequah.

The Maidas 1-11 claims were staked in 1929 by P.E. Hallum, G. Norman, and associates, of Juneau, Alaska. The claims were staked on what was presumed to be the south-easterly extension of the Ericksen-Ashby showings (104 K/11, Ag 1). Subsequent activity has probably been carried out as part of the Ericksen-Ashby property.
