DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT/DESCRIPTION DU GISEMENT

The formation consists of slates and shales intruded by dykes of andesite and granite porphyry. A number of north-westerly striking veins have been found with widths varying from several inches up to 10 feet. Quartz is practically the only gangue mineral in these veins, and with the intercalated layers and fragments of wall rock constitute nearly the entire vein filling, with the exception of small amounts of native gold, pyrite, and iron oxide.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT  
HISTORIQUE DE L'EXPLORATION ET DE LA MISE EN VALEUR

The Gleaner group of 3 claims, located east of and adjoining the Engineer mine, was located in 1900. The owners formed a joint stock company, Gleaner Mining and Milling Company, in 1901. Intermittent development work included open cuts and trenches; a 180 foot long crosscut driven in the direction of No. 3 vein; a 35 foot long adit driven on a 8 inch quartz vein; and a 40 foot deep shaft.

Gleaner Consolidated Gold Mines, Ltd. was formed in November 1922 to carry on the exploration work. During 1925 some 700 feet of open cutting, 400 feet of crosscut tunnelling, and 50 feet of sinking was done. All work by the company ceased early in the summer of 1926. Exploration work was carried on in 2 crosscut adits, the longest of which is approximately 750 feet in length, with 3 drifts from 6 to 12 feet in length on its north wall and one drift 25 feet in length on its south wall. The Gleaner group of 3 claims, the Lakeview (Lot 241), Taku Chief (Lot 240), and Myosotis (Lot 239) were Crown-granted to the Gleaner Mining and Milling Company in 1902.
