Disseminations and irregular lenses of pyrrhotite and pyrite, with minor amounts of chalcopyrite, tetrahedrite, galena, sphalerite, cassiterite, and scheelite occur in talcose basic volcanics and peridotite. Minor molybdenite mineralization is exposed in a trench on the Bub 15 claim.
