HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

The property is located at the 5,200 foot elevation at the head of Boulder Creek approximately 13 miles northeast of Atlin.

The Consolidated Mining and Smelting Company of Canada Limited in 1969 staked this ground as part of the Tungsten group (Tungsten No. 14 claim) and was known as the "North showing". Some stripping and trenching was reported.

Black Diamond Tungsten Limited held this showing in the 1950's as part of a group of 52 claims and fractions.

Canadian Johns-Manville Company, Limited held the Hobo, AT, and X groups covering a number of showings at the head of Boulder creek from about 1968. The North showing was staked as the Hobo 44 claim. Exploration work to 1972 included geological mapping, and geochemical and geophysical surveys.
