DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT/DESCRIPTION DU GISEMENT

The occurrence is reported to consist of a well-defined quartz vein, averaging about 18 inches in width accompanied by a light coloured acid dyke both of which are mineralized with iron sulphides, and which carry gold in varying amounts. Another vein, said to be similar in composition, was reported cut on the 60 foot level of the shaft on the Sydney Fraction.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT
HISTORIQUE DE L'EXPLORATION ET DE LA MISE EN VALEUR

The Beavis Group, comprising the Gold, Gold No. 2 and Sydney Fraction mineral claims is situated on the shore of Atlin Lake about 1 mile northwest of Atlin.

Prior to 1913 an incline shaft was sunk 50 feet on the Sydney Fraction, and on the Gold claim a 30-foot shaft was also sunk. The shaft on the Sydney claim was later (1908) deepened to 170 feet, by the Gold Group Mining Company Ltd. Two levels were established one on 60 feet, with 175 feet of drifting; and one at 120 feet with 250 feet of drifting. It is reported that good values in gold were found in all workings; although there is no record of any work having been done since 1908.

Samples of dump material assayed by the B.C. Dept. of Mines (A.R. 1904, p. 78), showed gold, but not in sufficient quantity to be economic.

The Gold Star group of 5 claims, located east of and adjoining the Beavis group, was owned by Wm. Gass and associates in 1904. The claims were staked on a number of east-west trending quartz veins that are somewhat more split up into veinlets than on the adjoining Beavis property. A shaft was sunk 35 feet on a particularly well silicified portion of the formation. A sample of quartz from the dump at the side of the shaft assayed: gold, 50¢ a ton; silver, 0.3 ounce a ton.
