On the surface the values appeared to be in a decomposed quartzose dyke, but from the dump it would appear that the work done has followed a quartz vein occurring in a serpentine rock. In the quartz on the dump free gold was visible.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT
HISTORIQUE DE L'EXPLORATION ET DE LA MISE EN VALEUR

This claim is located on Pine Creek about "four below Discovery" approximately 5 miles northeast of Atlin.

The Red Jacket claim was located in 1899 and a shaft was sunk at the side of the creek to a depth of about 50 feet by the Nimrod Syndicate of London, England. Work ceased in 1900 due to litigation and the claim subsequently passed into the hands of J.M. Ruffner, of the North Columbia Gold Mining Company. In 1902 the company ran a drift from the shaft for about 100 feet.
