## DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

Gold occurs in quartz veins in the Sylvester group of volcanics. The main showing is a wide quartz shear zone at the contact of sediments on the west and tuffs on the east. A sample across 3.6 feet of vein on Hunter No. 4 claim assayed: gold, 0.20 oz./ton; silver, 0.4 oz./ton.

Associated minerals or products of value - Silver.

## HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

The property is located near the head of Huntergroup Creek about 12 miles southeast of Cassiar.

A number of quartz veins were discovered in this area in 1935. The Hunter group, owned by Messrs. Vollaug, Erickson, and associates, of McDame Creek, was one of several properties optioned by the Consolidated Mining and Smelting Company of Canada Limited in October 1936. Trenching and sampling was carried out by the company in 1937; the option was subsequently abandoned.
