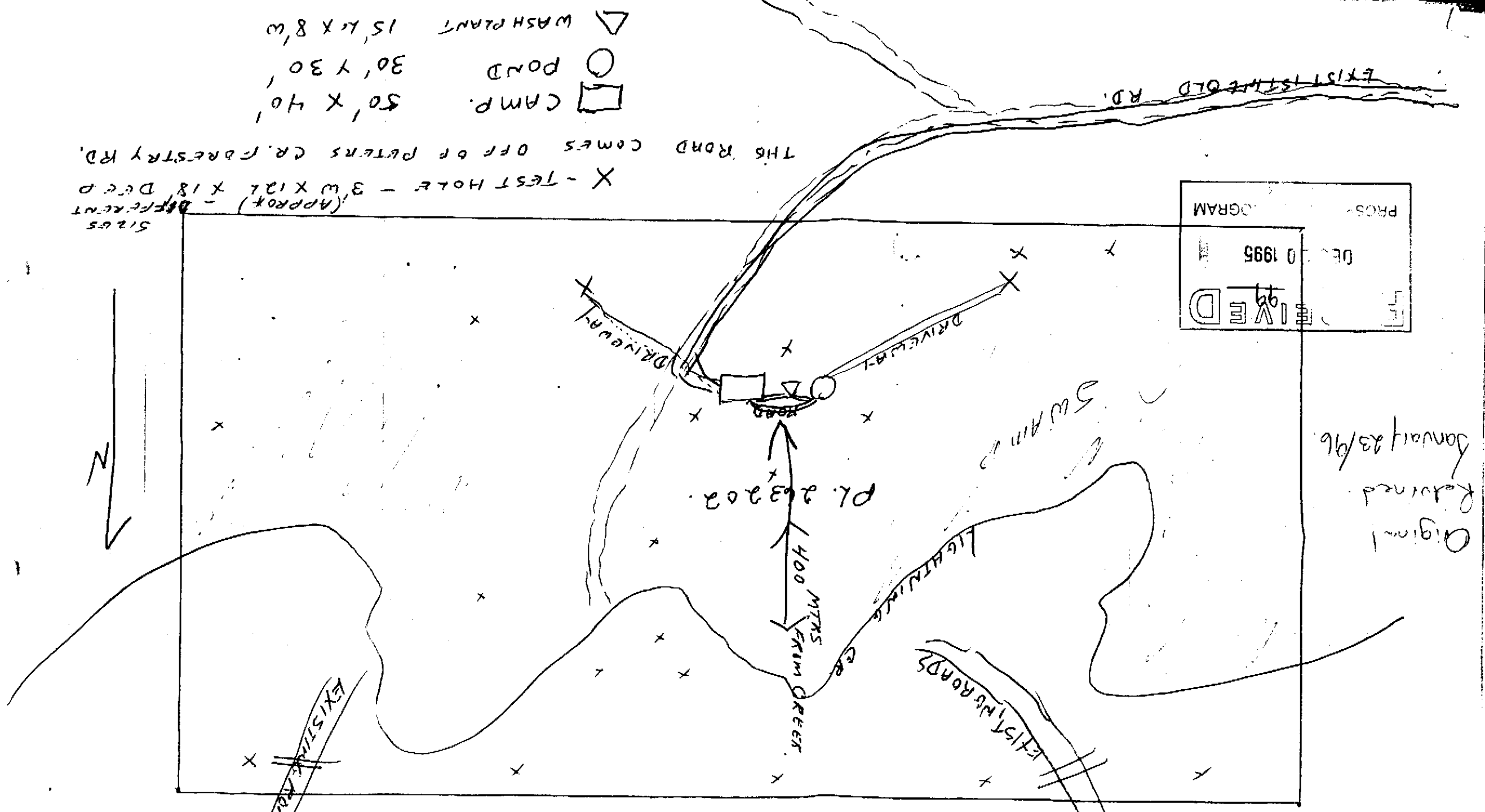

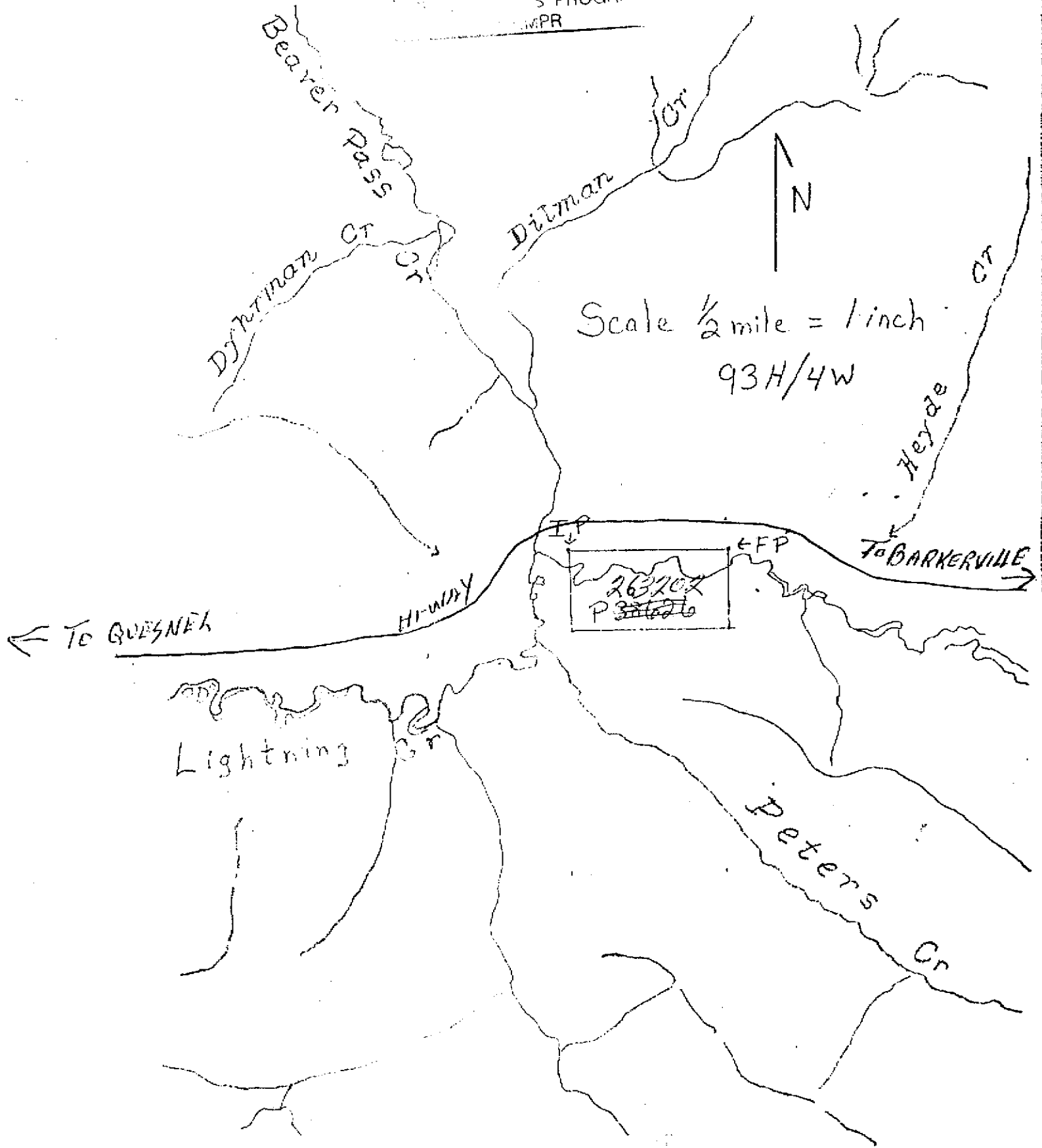

THE PROCESS WE USED IN RECOVERING GOLD FROM THE GRAVEL WAS. -

- 2 YDS OF GRAVEL AT A TIME WAS PUT INTO A HOPPER OF A LARGE SLUICE, (VIBRATING), WASHED DOWN TO A NON VIBRATING BOTTOM SLUICE - COVERED WITH MATTING + EXPANDED METAL.

- MATTS WERE WASHED, SLUICES, SCRAPPED, AND TAILINGS WERE PUT DOWN SMALLER SLUICE WITH HAND SCOOPS - THIS SLUICE WAS COVERED WITH MATTS + RIFFLES.

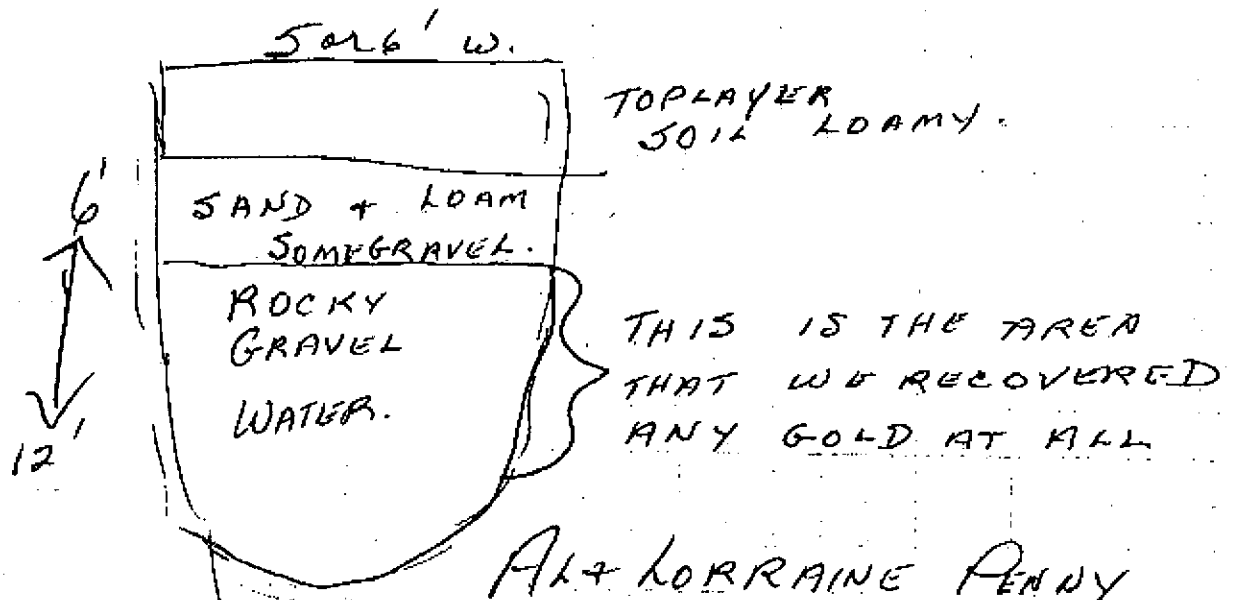
- REMOVED ALL PARTICLES, SCRAPPED + WASHED MATTS INTO A BUCKET

- THIS MATERIAL WHICH CONSISTED OF SAND, BLACK SAND AND SOME FLAKES OF GOLD.

- WE THEN SEPARATED WHAT WE COULD, GETTING THE GOLD WITH TWEEZERS, USING HEAT, AND MAGNETS.

WE ARE STILL LEFT WITH 1 GAL BUCKET OF BLACK SAND.

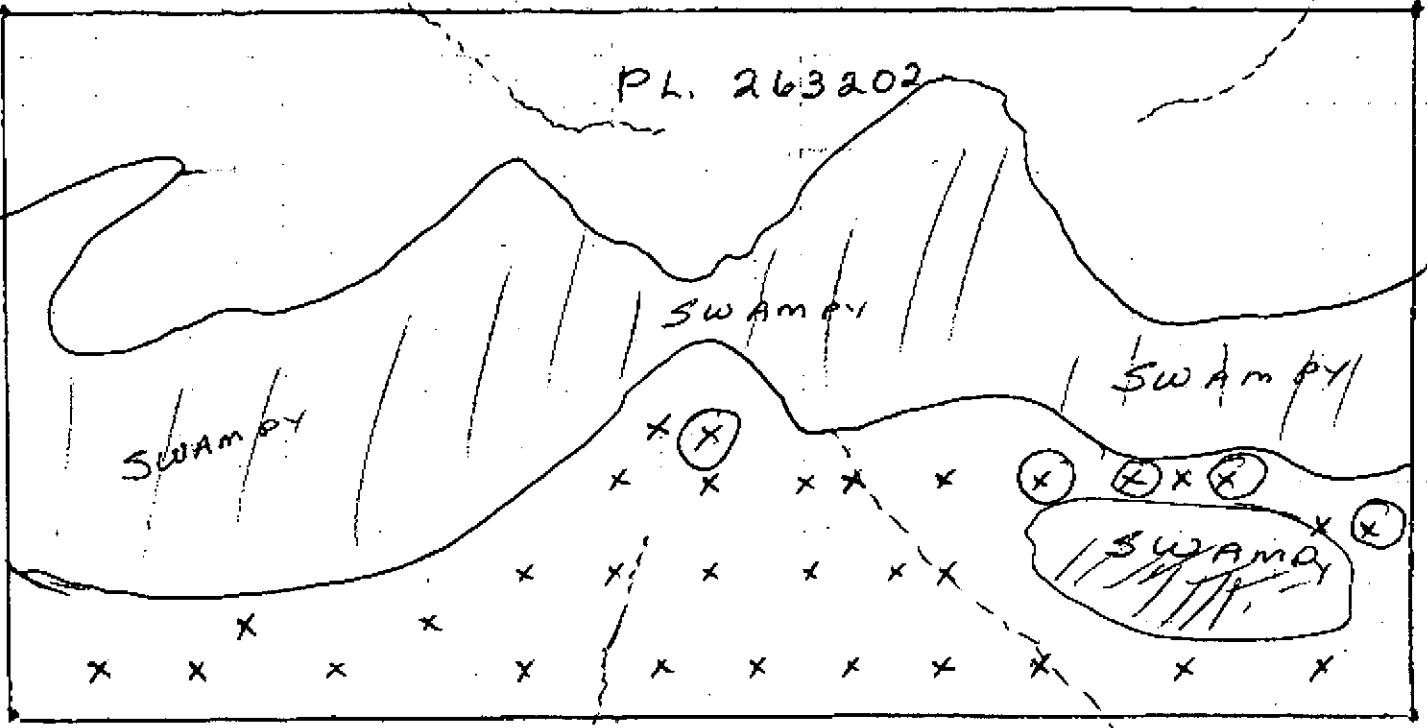
